## **OUR ITINERARY**

#### Day 1, Saturday, April 16 - Depart USA for Rome

Late afternoon departure from Montauk to New York's JFK Airport



#### Day 2, Sunday, April 17 - In Rome (D)

Arrival in Rome. After Immigration, Customs and baggage claim, our tour representatives will meet us as we board our coach for the drive to our reserved accommodations. Balance of the afternoon to relax and/or explore the city on our own before a "Welcome to Italy" dinner at our hotel. Overnight in Rome.

#### Day 3, Monday, April 18 - In Rome (B)

After breakfast depart for our tour of Imperial Rome featuring the Forum, the statue of Moses by Michelangelo, and the Coliseum, reliving the brutal entertainment of the gladiators and the lions that was refereed by the Emperor himself. Then on to the Vatican to visit St. Peter's Basilica and the Pieta by Michelangelo. Our visit culminates in the Sistine Chapel, the room where the pope is elected. We



enter in total silence, not wanting to disturb Michelangelo's famed frescoes, depicting stories from the Bible and the "End of Times." We'll be fascinated by which of Michelangelo's contemporaries he assigned to heaven and which to hell. The balance of the day is free for independent activities and shopping. Dinner on our own. Overnight in Rome.

#### Day 4, Tuesday, April 19 - In Rome (B)

After breakfast, the day is free for independent activities in the "eternal city." Why not start with an espresso in Piazza Navona. Or toss a coin into the Trevi Fountain to ensure your return, and then stroll across the Tiber for another look at the Vatican. Rome is a great city for walking, shopping and people watching. You can visit museums or take a seat at a café and watch the numerous contrasts reflected in a glorious past and prosperous presence. This evening try one of the wonderful local Italian restaurants on your own. Overnight in Rome.

#### Day 5, Wednesday, April 20 - To Florence (B/)

Dinner at our hotel. Overnight in Florence.

#### Day 6, Thursday, April 21 – Free morning in Florence. To Venice (B)

A morning in Florence - the fountainhead of the Renaissance; city of Dante, Boccaccio, Botticelli and da Vinci! But first, a visit to the Galleria dell'Accademia and a must viewing of Michelangelo's statue of David. Then a little bit of time to shop and walk around this wonderful city is a treat. After an early lunch on your own, we depart for the "City of Canals," Venice. Dinner on your own at one of the many quaint and delightful restaurants along the canals. Overnight in Venice.

#### Day 7, Friday, April 22 - In Venice (B/D)

After breakfast,, we start our stay with a walking tour of Venice will feature St. Mark's Square, the Doge's Palace, the Dungeons and the Bridge of Sighs. 
